

Session: The Decision Making body of Faith Presbyterian Church

Presbyterian Churches use a representational form of governance, which encourages committed members to participate in decision making, while providing for those who have the gifts and skills to lead to congregation to be act with appropriate authority and accountability. This is the manner in which we live out the Apostle Paul's description of a congregation as the Body of Christ. Jesus Christ is the head of the Church and we each have unique gifts to offer and particular work to do (1 Corinthians 12).

Every year the congregation elects a new "class" of ruling elders to serve for a three-year term on Session, which is the council for the congregation. The Session, composed of ruling elders and the teaching elder/s (pastor/s) of the congregation, is responsible for governing the congregation, guiding its witness to God's activity in the world, and ensuring that the congregation is a community of faith, hope, and love.

The Session of Faith Presbyterian Church is currently composed of thirteen ruling elders. One member of Session serves as clerk, handling minutes, correspondence, and maintenance of the rolls of the congregation. Other members of Session serve as leaders of the teams of Session: Worship, Mission, Christian Education, Pastoral Care and Fellowship, Evangelism and Outreach, Stewardship, Business Management, and Personnel.
