- Fellowship events such as laser tag, bowling, Frisbee golf, and the Amazing Race downtown with other youth groups;

- Flamingo flocking and pretzel sales;
- TGIF (Teens Growing in Faith), a program of fellowship with developmentally challenged teens;
- "Souper" Bowl of Caring-cooking for the Westminster Neighborhood Ministries "Tailgate Party;"
- Making soup and baked goods to sell to benefit "Second Helpings;"
- Supporting a girl from a third world country through Sunday School offerings;
- Making a youth video for the Presbyterian Foundation based on Micah 6:8;
- Hosting a 3 on 3 Basketball tournament and Cajun food sale;
- Stuffing Easter eggs, packing college care packages, making fleece blankets;
- Planning and going on an amazing mission trips, getting out of our comfort zone, making friends with people of great faith, scraping and painting a house, and bringing some smiles to the faces of children and youth;
- Sharing our mission trip and exploring "Rebuilding" during the Youth Sunday Worship service;
- Serving the church through "Job Jar" Sunday;
- Planning and presenting the Christmas Eve family service with youth musicians, actors and worship leaders;
- Mini-mission trip and retreat at Camp Pyoca; and
- Holding a "brief" scavenger hunt in sub-zero temperatures and celebrating Christmas.
